

LITERACY

Non-Fiction Unit of Study/Writer's Workshop: Opinion Writing

Students will spend the next two weeks drafting their final opinion piece. We are working on clearly stating an opinion and developing three supporting paragraphs. Students will be researching information to incorporate into their writing to support their opinions. They will be making revisions and editing their work for publication. The last week before break, they will be presenting their opinion writing to the class. Students are being encouraged to practice reading their opinion piece aloud as presentation skills such as volume, expression, and eye contact will be assessed. They do not need to have their essays memorized, but they should be comfortable enough with what they wrote to be able to look up and make eye contact with the audience.

LMC: Historical Fiction Book Project

Students began an analysis of their historical fiction book during LMC this week. This project involves research to determine which parts of the story are historically accurate and which parts are fiction. Students are learning to evaluate websites to determine if they are reliable resources.

Unit 9: Ratios

Students are learning to use ratios to compare two or three quantities. They will learn to make equivalent ratios and to find ratios in simplest forms. Mrs. McLoone will reach out with more information regarding test dates.

Unit 4: Areas of Polygons

In this unit, students will find the areas of triangles, special quadrilaterals, and other polygons. They will learn to find the distance between two points with the same x- or y-coordinate, as well as learn to draw polygons in the coordinate plane given vertices and how to find the length of sides.
